On behave of the Board and President of the Serra Club of North Central Dallas I know the work that both Larry Montz, District Governor of 46E, and Jim Duffy, President, have put into the Collin County Serra Club information. My prayers are with both of you and those who have walked this path with you.

Attached is Jim Duffy's letter to the members in the Collin County Club in-formation. (letter sent in November/December). Larry Montz has kept Bishop Kelly informed by email and the details of the situation. He has agreed with the decision.

The Serra Board of North Central Dallas has accepted the changes, and agreed with the decision.

Hello All.

This email has been very hard for me to compose, but in the last couple of months Larry (Montz) and I have come to the realization that it is time to suspend our effort to suspend our effort to charter the Serra Club of Collin County. We have fallen short in our many efforts to recruit sufficient members of the five parishes in McKinney, Allen and Frisco. We informed Bishop Kelly and he is in agreement.

We began our efforts in the summer of 2009, at the request of the Bishop, with a Saturday morning meeting with interested parishioners at St. Gabriel's. It has been seven (7) yeas and we have met many times with the pastors. While we enjoy the encouragement of the pastors and have used the tried and true formula for organizing a new Serra Club, our efforts have fallen short. Since it has been so long we are concerned about the possibility of wearing out our welcome. The last thing we Serrans want to do is add to the burden of the overworked clergy.

Sadly, we are suspending this effort and hope to revisit this in the future. It is our sincere hope that all of you will be willing to join Larry and I and move your Serra memberships to the Serra Club of North Central Dallas (NCD).

We believe that those of us in the five (5) parishes will be able to continue to operate as an activity group of NCD. Larry and I will be arranging with Our Lady of Angels to hold our meetings there. If we do this, it will not be necessary for you to attend all of NCD's monthly meetings. You will be able to fulfill your Serra attendance requirements without driving to Richardson on a regular basis.

So beginning with this letter the name Serra Club of Collin County in-formation is sadly discontinued.

Please let me know of your willingness to move your membership to NCD. I will take care of informing our parent club of the names of those among us who are transferring their membership. I also need to know if you wish to resign your membership.

Thank you all for what you do for vocations and thank you for giving me the honor of working with you for the past seven years. I am praying that you will all continue to work for vocations in the spirit of Serra. St. Juniperra Serra, pray for us.
